Steve Jobs was born in 1955. Steve was soon given up for adoption. Jobs met Steve Wozniak in the early 70’s, and by 1976 he, Steve Wozniak, and Ronald Wayne co-founded Apple Computer, Inc. Apple had a record-setting public stock offering in 1981 and made the Fortune 500 list in 1983. The first available personal computer was the Apple 2, released in 1977 by Steve Jobs’ company.

The first Macintosh was not successful. Steve did correct problems with the computer but was still fired by his own company in 1985. He rebounded by creating Next, Inc. in 1986, and purchased the graphics group division of Lucasfilm. He developed it into what is now known as Pixar Animation Studios. As president of Pixar, Jobs released the wildly successful, first completely animated feature film ‘Toy Story’. It earned \$192 million. In 1991 Steve married Laurene Powell, and they had three children together.

Apple brought Jobs back in 1996, buying Next for \$425 million and hiring Steve as an advisor. One year later he rose to the position of CEO of Apple. 2001 saw Jobs unveil IPOD, followed by Apple I-Tunes in 2003, changing the music industry forever.

Continuing his long string of successes, Disney bought Pixar for \$7.4 billion from Mr. Jobs in 2006. Steve joined Disney’s board and became the company’s biggest shareholder. Always creating and achieving technological breakthroughs, Steve Jobs introduced the I Phone and Apple TV in 2007. He changed the company name to Apple, Inc., followed by the debut of Apple I Pad in 2010.

Steve underwent pancreatic surgery in 2004. He retired in 2011 and died of pancreatic cancer at age 56. Speaking at a commencement ceremony, Steve said *“Death is the destination we all share. Death is very likely the single best invention of life. It’s life’s change agent. It clears out the old to make way for the new. Remembering that you are going to die is the best way I know of thinking you have something to lose. You are already naked, there is no reason not to follow your heart.”*
