"What lies behind you and what lies in front of you pales in comparison to what lies inside of you." Ralph Waldo Emerson Known as the Father of American Literature.

Emerson penned several essays in the mid-19th century that fundamentally changed the way America saw its cultural and artistic possibilities.

Born in 1803, the son of a Boston preacher, Ralph went to Harvard, then on to Harvard Divinity School. He was ordained in 1829 and married that same year. His wife died just two years later. Emerson embarked on a trip to Europe. There he understood that nature is in us, a part of us.

"If great men can be so ordinary, why should not ordinary men be great."

Emerson believed that man and nature are one, that everyone can recognize they are a uniquely significant human being.

Ralph returned to America, became a lecturer, remarried, and had several children. His central belief was in being self-reliant rather than living in a way that others think we should; that there is a divine spark in each of us. "We can rebuild ourselves," he declared.

"To laugh often and much, to win the respect of intelligent people, and the Affection of Children. To earn the appreciation of honest critics and endure the betrayal of false friends. To appreciate beauty, to find the best in others. To leave the world a bit better, whether by a healthy child, a garden patch, or a redeemed social condition. To know even one life has breathed easier. This is to have succeeded."
